Steps to Success: Communicating with Your Child's School

We strive to be the best place to learn. The only way we can improve is to know about concerns so we are able to address them. Here are some tips for communicating with your child's school when concerns arise.

The fastest way to a positive result is to start with the people closest to the situation in the school. Talk with the teacher or coach about your questions and concerns before going to the principal.

Parents and guardians are encouraged to reach out to teachers and school staff by:

- Calling the school's phone number. Because they are teaching, you often will need to leave a message for your child's teacher or coach.
- Emailing the teacher or coach directly. All teacher emails are available on our school website.

We want to be responsive to parents' questions and requests for information. Our staff will respond to your call or email as soon as possible, in most cases within 2 school days.

If you have had a conversation with your child's teacher and the principal and are still needing assistance, the director of elementary or secondary programs will be able to provide additional support.


We are excited for this new school year and look forward to partnering with you to support a great school experience for your student.

Directory Information

In accordance with Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA), USD 305 has designated certain information as directory information. This information is considered public information which may be released from the school district without your prior consent. Please inform your school building in writing that any or all of the directory information should not be released without your prior consent (by August 25, 2023 to ensure it is not included in a parent directory). The following information is considered directory information:

- I. The student's name and age
- II. Parent's name, address and telephone number
- III. The student's major field of study and class designation (i.e. first grade, tenth grade)
- IV. The student's participation in officially recognized activities or sports
- V. The weight and height of members of athletic teams
- VI. Dates of attendance (period of time during which a student was enrolled in an educational agency or institution, i.e. academic year, spring semester)

The social emotional team will be teaching Bullying Prevention lessons throughout the month of September. This curriculum consists of 4 total lessons focusing on Recognizing, Reporting, and Refusing bullying. We want students to recognize what is bullying vs. a peer conflict, how/who to report bullying to, and how to stop and stand up against bullying. Peer conflicts are an opportunity to teach, and are expected at the elementary school level. We want students to feel empowered to handle bullying as well as peer conflicts. As we head into October, we will celebrate Red Ribbon week. Stay tuned for more information!

Heusner Elementary is a Title I School

Each year, our school qualifies for federal dollars to help support the education of our students. We are required to notify the parents or guardians of each student that information regarding the professional qualifications of your student's classroom teachers are available upon request. You may request information on:

- Whether the teacher has met State qualification and licensing criteria for the grade levels and subject areas in which the teacher provides instruction.
- Whether the teacher is teaching under emergency or other provisional status through which State qualification or licensing criteria have been waived.
- The baccalaureate degree major of the teacher and any other graduate certification or degree held by the teacher, and the field of discipline of the certification or degree.
- Whether the child is provided services by para-professionals and, if so, their qualifications.

Annual Notice of Teacher Qualifications

Salina Public Schools is proud of our record of employing the highest quality teachers and paraprofessional available. As a parent or guardian, you have the right to inquire about the professional qualifications of all instructional staff serving your child. Specific information is available from your school's principal at any time throughout the year.

All Title Schools are required to make available the following information upon parent or guardian request:

- Whether the State of Kansas has licensed or qualified the teacher for the grades and/or subjects taught.
- Whether the teachers is teaching under an emergency permit or other provisional status through which Kansas licensing criteria have been waived.
- The teacher's college major and subject of any advanced degrees.
- Whether any instructional aides or paraprofessionals provide services to the child and, if so, the qualification of those staff members.

Make the Most of Your Parent-Teacher Conference!

Parent-teacher conferences provide an invaluable opportunity for adults at home and school to come together and discuss how to help students succeed. This open dialogue is an important support in students' school progress.

Scheduled for September 13 and 14, these meetings are an ideal avenue for parents to ask questions about their student's performance and behavior. Conferences provide space for communication with parents in a more personal manner, giving them insight into their student's strengths and weaknesses that they may not otherwise see from test scores or grades alone.

We look forward to visiting with you at parent-teacher conferences and working together to build a strong foundation that will help your student learn and grow. With continued communication between home and school, we can make sure our students get the support they need to succeed.

Did You Know?

- Starting in Kindergarten, too many absences can cause children to fall behind in school.
- Missing 10% or about 18 days can make it harder to learn to read.
- Absences can affect the whole classroom if the teacher has to slow down learning to help children catch up.

What Can You Do?

- Lay out clothes and pack backpacks the night before.
- Don't let your child stay home unless she is truly sick
- If your child seems anxious about going to school, talk to teachers, school counselors, or other parents for advice on how to make them feel comfortable and excited about learning.


